Civil and Human Rights Committee Sept. 2015

The Committee did not meet this month, however, we are submitting the following report regarding the Pittsburgh LCLAA's annual Hispanic Heritage Month event which was held on September 19, 2015.

This last Saturday was Pittsburgh LCLAA's second annual ¡Que Viva Clemente! celebration of Hispanic Heritage month, at which the chapter honors the life and legacy of the great Pittsburgh Pirate Roberto Clemente, the first Latino ever inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame and the first Latino member of the Executive Board of the Baseball Players Association.

This year's event was made possible by the generous support of the USW International, Districts 1, 4, 10, 13 and USW Local 3657 as well as the Allegheny County Central Labor Council, SEIU Healthcare PA., SEIU Local 668, the Pittsburgh Federation of Teachers, AFSCME District Council 84, Pride At Work Pennsylvania, the Pittsburgh CBTU, IUOE Local 66, and the Pennsylvania AFL-CIO. The event was held at the Roberto Clemente Museum in Pittsburgh. In addition to being a cultural celebration with Latin American food, wine, live dance and music, the event also highlighted the work of Pittsburgh LCLAA in advocating for comprehensive immigration reform and combatting wage theft. The event also served as a fundraiser for one of the Pittsburgh Latino community's most important nonprofit service providers, Casa San Jose. The nonprofit provides assistance to new Latin American immigrants with respect to jobs, housing, health care and education. The event raised \$15,000 for Casa San Jose.
