

Fight Back Pittsburgh – USW Local 3657 Organizing Committee Monthly Report—March 2016

- On February 26th, Fight Back Pittsburgh partnered with United Students Against Sweatshops
 Local #31 for a major march and rally in Oakland kicking off the campaign for \$15/hour for all
 workers at the University of Pittsburgh. The city refused to permit our march but still about 400
 students and community supporters took to the streets in an unpermitted march, shutting
 down a large portion of Oakland during rush hour.
- During this month's General Membership Meeting, Fight Back Pittsburgh will be joined by Fast Food and Hospital Workers who are standing up for \$15 and a union. Join us at 6:30pm on Monday, April 4 to find out how to get involved in some exciting upcoming actions.
- At this month's membership meeting, Fight Back Pittsburgh will also be voting on several
 changes to our bylaws that have been introduced at the two previous meetings. We believe
 that these changes will allow us to make our meetings more productive and give new activists
 better opportunities to get involved in the day-to-day work of the organization. The proposed
 bylaws changes are available on Fight Back Pittsburgh's website.
- On April 14, Fight Back Pittsburgh will be joining students, fast food workers and hospital workers for the Day of Action for a Livable Pittsburgh demanding \$15/hour and a union for all workers in Pittsburgh. There will be several actions around town throughout the day culminating with a major march and rally in Oakland (starting at the corner of Forbes and Bigelow) at 3:30pm. - Fight Back Pittsburgh will be holding our first annual May Day Party from 3-7pm on May 1 at the Vietnam Veterans Pavilion in Schenley Park. Come out to join us for food, drinks and fun!

The coalition includes tenant and community organizers from several neighborhood based groups as well as housing justice experts from around the city.
