USW Local 3657 Civil Rights COMMITTEE Committee Report for February 2017

The Committee met this month and reports the following:

Regarding Constituency Group Activities:

LCLAA – The Committee discussed the vital role that the Local played in supporting the recent deportation defense campaign of Pittsburgh LCLAA on behalf of Martín Esquivel Hernández. Martin was a local community activist, and undocumented construction worker, who was arrested last May by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); one day after he marched in the May Day March for Immigrant and Worker Rights that Local 3657 helped to sponsor. With the national AFL-CIO and International USW not issuing statements opposing the Trump administration's executive orders on stepped up immigration enforcement, it may increasingly fall on Local 3657 to be the leader in District 10 in regards to challenging the new administration's policies with respect to the undocumented.

A good example of this was the Local Executive Board's decision to sign-on to an op-ed in the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette objecting to the deportation of Martín and the recent ICE sweeps that are causing fear throughout immigrant communities, including Pittsburgh (see attached). The CRC commends our Local leadership for standing with immigrant families and for being a part of a progressive group of local unions that set the example for the rest of organized labor. Continued support from the Local will be more important than ever.

On the evening of her husband's deportation, Alma Brigido, wife of Martín Esquivel Hernández, tearful but resolute, stood before a group of more than 150 supporters huddled in the rain, candles in their hands, determination in their hearts. With her children at her side, Alma declared: ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) succeeded in separating us, but they will never succeed in dividing us. Alma bravely declared that our fight to stop her husband's deportation is only just the beginning of a broader fight for immigrant rights in Pittsburgh.

As leaders in the labor movement, we recognize that the struggle of American immigrants like Martin is deeply intertwined with the struggle for working families. Martin Esquivel Hernández came to America in pursuit of a family-sustaining job that could provide stability and security for his family. We spent months in the streets fighting to stop Martin's deportation because it is our life's work to ensure that all workers are given the basic rights they deserve. All workers deserve a living wage, a voice at work, and the right to live without fear, regardless of their immigration status.

We stand with the Esquivel family, and with all immigrant families who seek sanctuary and the prospect of a better life in the United States for themselves and their families. Martin's deportation did not occur in a vacuum — days later, unprecedented ICE raids rounded up four immigrants in Pittsburgh and nearly 700 immigrants across the country. The Trump administration is actively sowing anti-immigrant hatred and creating terror in our immigrant communities. They feel the tangible fear of more raids and the gaping holes left behind when families are torn apart. Our places of work, our neighborhoods, our schools and universities feel the loss of civic leadership, community engagement, talent, and innovation when we turn our backs on immigrants and their contributions. Our economy suffers the loss of tax revenue, productivity, and entrepreneurship. Our country, our cities, and our communities cannot endure a loss of this magnitude; we cannot afford to go backwards.

We will continue to fight for the rights of all workers, no matter where they were born, and we call upon our elected officials to do everything in their power to stop ICE and the Trump administration from breaking up more families. As Martín's supporters chanted in unison on Feb. 7: "ni una más deportación." The time is now for all of us to stand with immigrant communities and demand: not one more deportation.
